Ridgefield's Roundabout Considerations

- Safety, especially for pedestrian passage
 - Roundabouts allow for fewer points where vehicles cross paths
 - Less waiting time and can handle more vehicles than a signalized intersection
 - Fewer crashes
 - Lower maintenance costs
- Should not have straight line-of-sight
 - Deter drivers to drive straight or fast through the roundabout
 - Protection of roundabout features: wall, boulders, etc.
- Native plants and trees
- Won't distract drivers
 - We want them to keep their eyes on other traffic
 - Make sure pedestrians are visible when entering and leaving the roundabout.

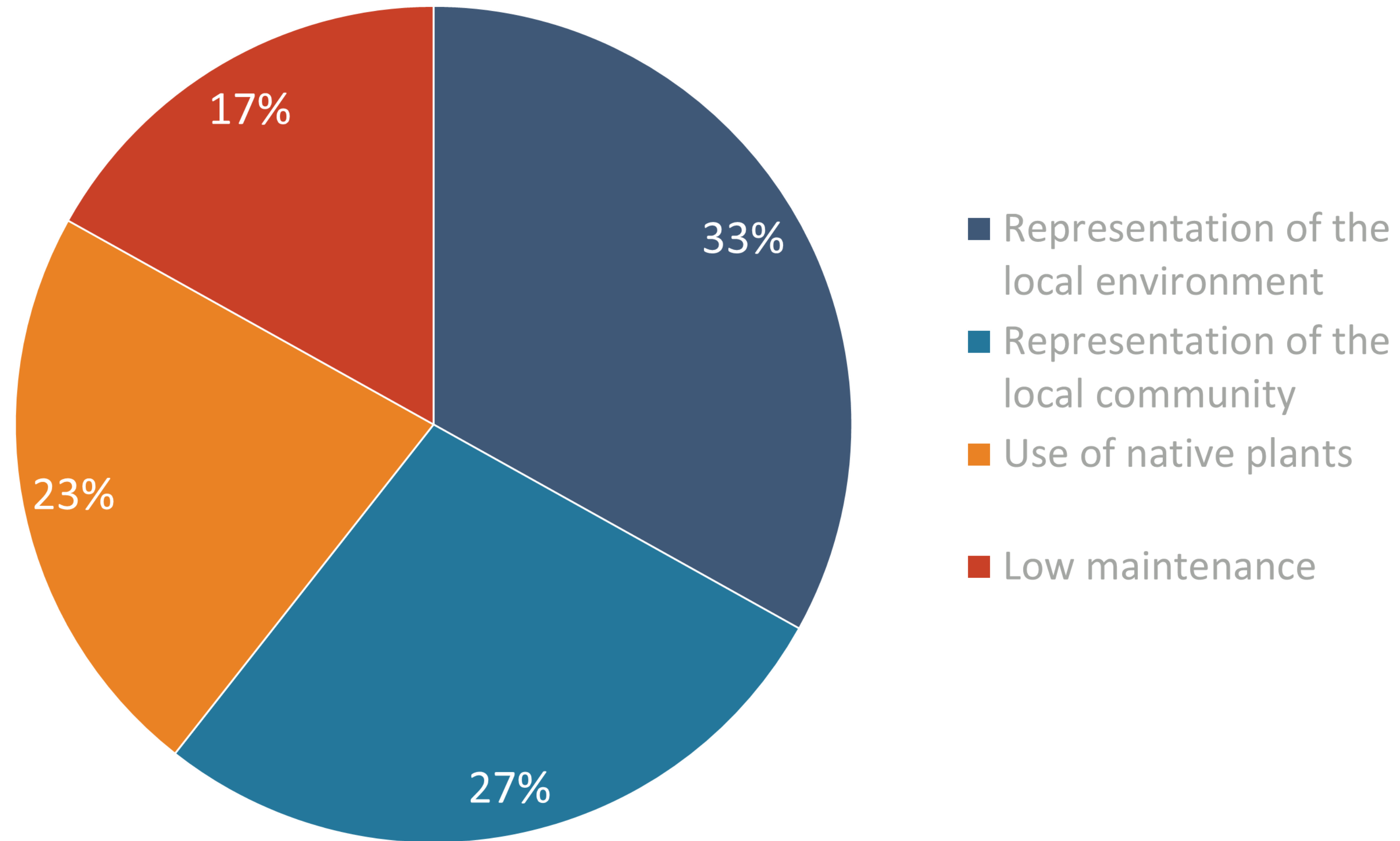
