Pioneer Street at 35th Avenue

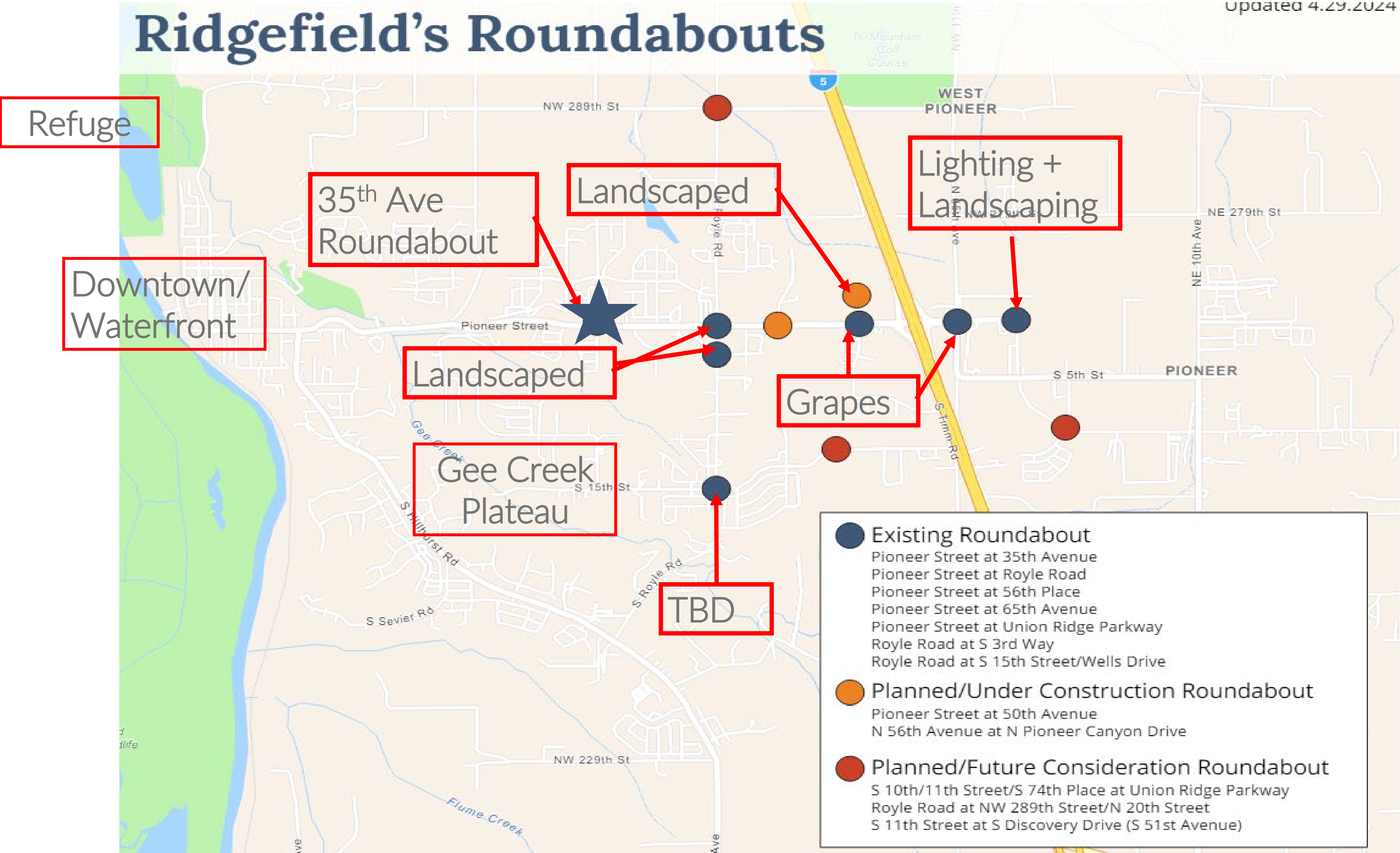
- Built with Pioneer Street at 35th Avenue roundabout project

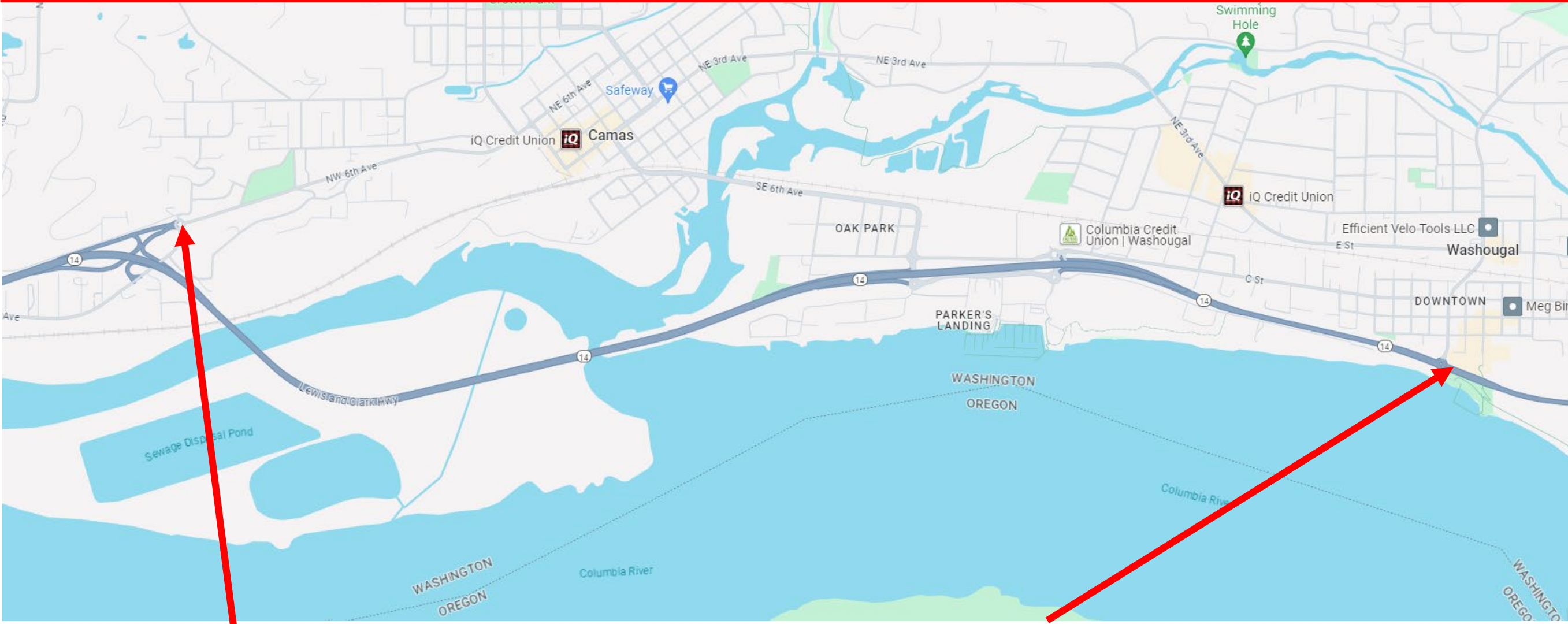

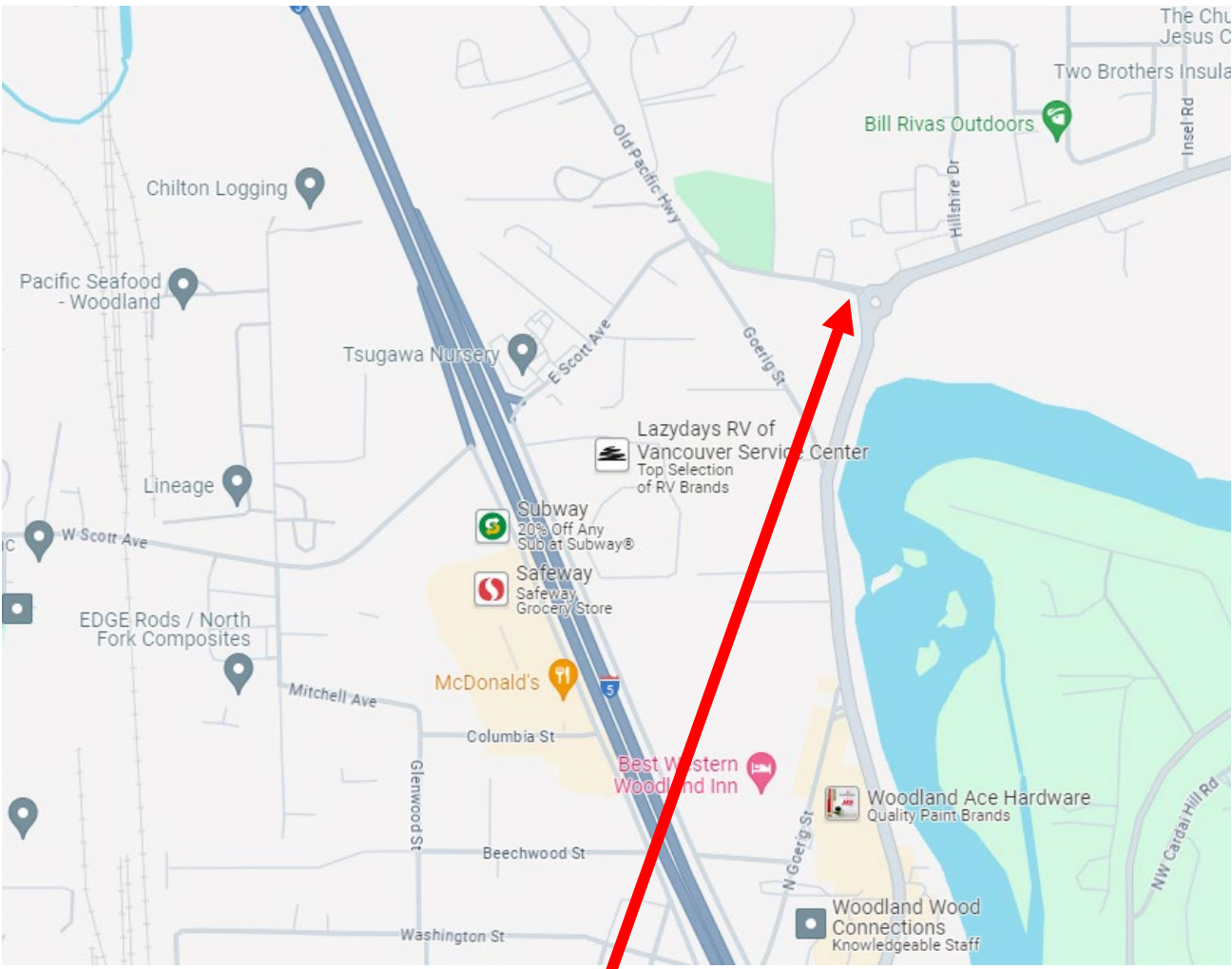

Art represents Woodland as a Gateway to Mt. St. Helens. The metal represents the volcano, lighting at night represents the snow cap/ glacier at the top. Woodland Kiwanis Club maintains the roundabout.

Art provides safety barrier from encroachment into roundabout. “City of Camas” is internally lit at night.



SR 14 at Washougal River Road, Washougal



Center design was chosen by a landscaping committee. The design features unique, low maintenance landscaping utilizing native plants. Artistic features were inspired by Washougal's indigenous roots, natural beauty, and historic industries.

Center art features sculptures of fish and birds, created by a local artist. The sculptures are flanked by mounds of blue-hued grasses to create the appearance of rippling water. The art represents Washougal as the “Gateway to the Gorge.” The raptor pole and nest are at the side of the roundabout, not in the center.
