**Ridgefield Roundabouts Design Standards Approach** Working DRAFT Summary  
10.1.25 hg10/13/25

Safety:

- Knee walls to slow down an errant vehicle and protect the art/plantings in the roundabout.

Landscaping:

- Extensive Use of Native Plants in designs because of 1) lower maintenance (little to no pruning), 2) low water use (after plantings are established) 3) supports bees and other pollinators and local area birdlife/wildlife.
- Use of boulders and logs to provide natural appearance and habitat

Art

- Creates beauty -- and reminds us of our local history and/or our local & regional identity
- **Low maintenance**
- **Easy to understand from a distance – not so intricate or small to not see from a distance. Big and somewhat vertical.**
- Non-reflective
- Support local artists
- Creates visual interest – while not providing distractions for drivers
- Art should not invite people to physically enter the roundabout (i.e., staircase or phone booth)

Lighting and irrigation --

- Variable based on design, location, and purpose/goal of specific roundabout design

General:

- Try to establish a theme and/or some unity among the roundabouts. This has been challenging but the use of different native birdlife has been suggested (and dovetails with our Wildlife Refuge identity)
- Unity in use of native plants
- Demonstration of progress throughout the city
- The theme is “Telling the story of Ridgefield” through the roundabouts?
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Maintenance standards:

- Work towards a "forest floor" concept where leaves and decaying plant matter are allowed to stay in place to break down thereby maintaining soil quality, preventing evaporation, and providing habitat for insects. (Minimal blowing, no annual application of bark dust in between plants. Allow plants to fill in naturally and shade out weeds, create a more naturalistic appearance while still being intentional.
- Maintain ease of access for water/sewer/utilities.

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
